'Sharing the Lessons and Reducing the Risk' when working with children in Gloucestershire





Always keep a clear focus on the experiences of the child. This can be difficult when having to negotiate the many demands and difficulties of the parents, especially those who can be manipulative and may disguise compliance.



Communication across and between agencies needs to be open and transparent. Information sharing between agencies should not be seen as a barrier.



The impact of neglect on a child's safety, wellbeing and development is significant. Professionals should focus on building a shared understanding of the child's history through a chronology of significant events across all agencies involved.



It is the robustness of the plan that will keep the child safe. Plans must have the child's needs at the heart, include the involvement of all agencies and the family and a contingency plan



Reflection on Safeguarding Practice is essential for all staff, especially when dealing with complex abuse and neglect cases.



Healthy challenge is an important part of working with families and other professionals. Be persistent, have an inquiring mind and keep asking questions. Professional disagreement is a positive sign of a healthy safeguarding system
