Group 1

•For staff with infrequent contact with children/young people and/or parents/carers who may become aware of possible abuse or neglect

Group 2

•Those with regular contact or have a period of intense but irregular contact with children, young people and/or parents/carers including all health clinical staff, who may be in a position to identify concerns about maltreatment.

Group 3

•Members of the workforce who work predominantly with children, young people and/or their parents/carers and who could potentially contribute to assessing, planning, intervening and reviewing the needs of a child and parenting capacity where there are safeguarding concerns

Group 4

•Members of the workforce who have particular responsibilities in relation to child protection enquiries, including professionals from health, education, police and children's social care; those who work with complex cases and social work staff responsible for coordinating assessments of children in need

Group 5

•Named professionals and designated lead professionals.

Group 6

- Operational managers at all levels, including practice supervisors
- •frontline managers and managers of child protection units

Group 7

•Senior managers with strategic management responsibilities

•Members of the Gloucestershire Safeguarding Children Partnership Executive
